## SECTION 119 - HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 PROPOSED DIVERSION OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH C8 AT FLECKNEY

An application has been received for the diversion of footpath C8 at Fleckney as shown on proposal plan attached hereto.

The diversion has been requested in the interest of the owner of the land to erect a new gate on footpath C8 at Fleckney. This brought to light an anomaly with the route of the path. At some time in the past a new fence was erected which took no account the legal line of the path and effectively obstructed it in two places.

I have consulted with the Director of Community Services who has stated that should the proposal be approved, the alternative footpath will be subject to the following conditions:-

· The path should have a specified minimum width of 2 metres.


