

Position statement

ASB trend followed a similar line to last year in the last 6 months with an overall yearly drop of 150 cases (22%) with a peak in July and August.

Criminal damage showed a slight drop from 484 to 458.

Looking at managed cases on Sentinel the majority were related to adults including issues around cannabis smell, noise and neighbour disputes. County ASB group are working on guidance for dealing with Cannabis smells. Likely that we will use Community Protection Notices to target nuisance of the smell.

In November we had a large gathering of youths on Little Bowden rec and in Sainsburys area the weekend of 19th/20th. HDC cleared litter, police wrote to all parents at Welland Park Academy and Robert Smyth about under age drinking/ buying alcohol for minors etc. and Impact team did a short period of work. This did not re-occur.

There were also reports of fireworks being set off and being thrown in Lutterworth during, police spoke to shops about selling to underage did proactive patrols in the run up to Bonfire night.

In last quarter we had reports of low level ASB at Swannington industrial estate (vehicle noise) in Broughton Astley, we considered moving our re-deployable camera, but the reports declined and stopped as we went into lockdown.
