## **Local Transport Plan**

# **Chapter 4) Transport Vision**

- HDC support the objectives of the Local Transport Plan that includes tackling the climate emergency, improving air quality and health. HDC agree they are all important to sustain the city in the future.
- Section 4.5, guiding principle 4 (p39) promotes the Leicester Bus Improvement Plan. It is important that this plan reflects the true travel to work patterns of those that commute into Leicester and therefore includes areas outside of the City boundary in order to provide an effective bus service. It is noted in figure 14 (p49) that the hub and spoke plan is looking to extend a bus corridor to Scraptoft. This is supported.
- Section 4.5, guiding principle 5 (p41) is about supporting the delivery of priority regional and national intercity rail improvements linking into Leicester. This is strongly supported as such links are of benefit to the whole County and will support sustainable travel habits.

### Chapter 5) Key themes and proposed projects

The sustainable transport projects listed in the LTP are all supported and any
extension of these projects beyond the City boundary would be welcomed and
could also support HDC residents to choose sustainable transport options. Any
additional usage of such projects in areas outside the city boundary has the
potential to support their viability.

# Workplace Parking Levy

 Given that the workplace parking levy is about reducing car use and encouraging sustainable transport options then it is justified that some projects could extend beyond the city boundary where there are known commuter routes. This could include into parts of Harborough District including Scraptoft, Bushby and Thurnby.
