Home-Start South Leicestershire Fundraising Plan 2020-21

Funding Priorities 2020-21

Priorities are related to:

- Shortfall funding for key projects Family Post Natal Illness Project and Family Know-How Project, Young Parents Project and Active Families Project.
- Project development plans new/aspirational projects

Since our significant reorganisation in 2015-16, and successful delivery of pilot projects in 2016-17 and 2017-18, we returned to a focus on Post Natal Illness instead of general mental health difficulties within the FIMs project. We have now mainstreamed these two key projects and included the additions of Young Parents and Active Families Projects.

The following represents the current service structure of the organisation in 2020-21:

Family Know How Project

This project consists of the following services:

Supporting Families One to One - Home-Visiting Service

Total Project Cost: £17,628

Description: This service was previously funded through a contract with the Children's Centre Programme. Annual target of families is set in the Operational plan. Families are matched with a volunteer for visits with the family on a weekly basis at home for a couple of hours, or to accompany to a community venue or service. Additional support to the family is available through the Family Coordinator.

Family Support Groups

Total Annual Project Cost: £35,957

Remaining Shortfall: £9,500

Description: The service provides two Family Support Groups, one in Market Harborough and one in Lutterworth. These offer targeted and high quality group support specifically for those struggling with their family responsibilities for a wide variety of reasons.

All groups run on a fortnightly basis for 1.5 hours per session, and make a small charge of ± 1 per parent (with exceptions for those with financial difficulties). The groups are managed by the Family Co-ordinator and are additionally supported by the Assistant Coordinator as well as group volunteers.

Family Know How Courses

Total Project Cost: £9,839

Main Funding Source/s Confirmed: BBC Children in Need;

Shortfall Required: £800

Description: This 6 week course twice annually is designed to offer an intense group session to targeted families – 4 to 6 max families per course. Topics will cover healthy eating and budgeting for healthy meals, physical activity and play, plus keeping children safe/managing behaviour. Children's activities run in tandem in the Family Annexe with a similar theme of healthy eating and physical activity. **Key Funding Source Proposed:**

Family Post Natal Illness Project

This new project is drawn from previous work in our Mums in Mind Project delivered over 2 years ago, and is focused on the specific mental health needs of families where a main carer has PNI (whether formally diagnosed or suspected), and consists of the following services:

or to accompany to a community venue or service. Additional support to the family is available through the FIMs Co-ordinator.

Family PNI Groups

Total Project Cost: £35,969

Shortfall Required: £4,600

Description: This offers peer support through a parent and child group with a focus on a wide parental mental health need including anxiety, depression and attachment issues, and the effects on the child. Staffing is through the MIMs Coordinator and the Play Facilitator. The project group sessions take place in both Market Harborough and Broughton Astley.

Family PNI Course

Total Project Cost: £8226

Main Funding Source/s Confirmed: Market Harborough & The Bowdens Charity.) Remaining Shortfall Required: £2,000

Description: A course to offer parents experiencing PNI information and guidance to help them help themselves, including a session for partners. Topics will include Understanding PNI, Effect of PNI on you, your family and close relationships, and illness management techniques.

Active Families Project

Description: Coordinator and volunteer support to families with complex needs, and at least one child between 5 and 15 years, to improve their family physical activity levels.

Young Parents Project

New Developments - Projects/Services

Developmental areas will always be measured against the Home-Start South Leicestershire Strategic Plan in order to ensure a good fit with the organisation's key aim:

Helping to ensure, through a holistic family approach, that children living in the Harborough District stay safe, thrive, develop and learn through the range of services we offer families with young children.

Additionally, for any new developmental area or project proposal, a risk assessment has been devised (see Appendix C in the Fundraising Strategy 2019-22). This has been created in-house specifically for Home-Start South Leicestershire and provides a tool to assess the suitability of any proposal in terms of strategic, financial, practical and HR related considerations.

Any Key areas identified will be developed as "off the shelf" projects that can be easily aligned to specific funding opportunities as they arise. Although existing projects with ongoing funding needs will remain the priority, funding will be activity sought for these projects when there is capacity to do so. It is recognised and agreed that through appropriate and considered growth, Home-Start's capacity overall can be supported.

Income Generation Activities

Training

We are in the early stages of developing a new source of income through activities marketed and delivered to the universal population of local parents. We are receiving support through CASE, funded by Lloyds Bank Foundation, and aim to develop a marketing plan with them in the first quarter of the new financial year, with delivery of a pilot Universal Parent training course by autumn 2020. In addition we will be developing a Universal Parent Baby Massage session by autumn 2020, making creative use of existing staff certified to deliver this. We are currently developing our income/cost projection for this development.

Room Hire

We continue to let the organisation base to a number of organisations on a one off, or regular use basis. Regular users are Children's Social Care (Northamptonshire and Leicestershire - for contact sessions), Relate (weekly counselling sessions), and Hypnobirthing (private provider). We have established a policy on appropriate room hire which aligns with our charity Mission, and have a set rate of charges. Income from room hire currently contributes approximately £3-4,000 income annually.

Annual Fundraising Target 2020-21

Based on the specific service delivery plans outlined above in addition to core support functions, an approximate total fundraising need of **£60,600** above the secured income or anticipated income from funders, is needed in order to break even. This is anticipated to come through donations from individuals, unsolicited grants, fundraising events/activities, applications to Trusts and Foundations, applications to other funding bodies, a confirmed SLA arrangement with Harborough District Council, rental from room hire and interest on reserves.

It has been agreed and accepted that the organisation will continue to use its reserves this financial year if necessary in order to maintain staffing capacity to carry out the service commitments, should income fall short of budgeted expenses.

Our required reserves level based on 2020-21 expected income and expenditure is estimated at **£99,000.**
