1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Council has a duty to prepare, publish and maintain a Local Development Scheme (LDS) for the district.
- 1.2 In July 2021, the Council's Cabinet took the decision to begin the preparation of a new Local Plan. The Local Development Scheme sets out the timetable for the preparation of the new Local Plan, giving key production and public consultation stages as well as outlining the subject matter and geographical extent. It also enables the local community to find out about planning policies for their area by setting out the documents which currently form the development plan for Harborough District. The LDS is also an opportunity to provide information on any Supplementary Planning Documents to be prepared.
- 1.3 A new LDS was approved by Cabinet in September 2021, replacing the December 2017 version which set out the timetable for the adopted Harborough Local Plan 2011-2031 (adopted in April 2019).
- 1.4 The Council is required to keep under review the key milestones in the timetable within the LDS; some changes in context, especially at sub-regional and national level, may be driven by circumstances beyond the authority's control.
- 1.5 A key challenge is to keep Local Plan production to a 30-month timeframe, i.e., from Regulation 18 through to the Submission of the Draft Local Plan for Examination. Policy IMR1 in the adopted Local Plan amplifies the local circumstances requiring a Local Plan Review, either in part or in full.

2. Key Facts

- 2.1 The Harborough Local Plan 2011-2031 is a fundamental part of the 'plan-led' system. It was adopted in April 2019 and then underwent an internal officer review. This review demonstrated that the Local Plan remains up to date and continues to deliver sustainable development across the district.
- 2.2 Members will recall that the internal officer review identified that a significant increase in Leicester's housing need, combined with the requirement to meet resultant unmet need within Leicester and Leicestershire through the Duty to Cooperate. As a result, there has been significant inter-authority collaboration on strategic cross boundary matters, leading to the issue of joint evidence, (the Housing and Economic Needs Assessment (HENA), the Sustainability Appraisal (SA) and a draft Statement of Common Ground (SoCG)) on 13th May 2022.
- 2.3 In order to keep local communities and other stakeholders informed of local planning activity, the Council is required to prepare a Local Development Scheme (LDS) under Section 15 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended). In relation to the new Local Plan, the LDS must specify:
 - the subject matter of the document to be prepared and the geographical extent to which it relates;
 - whether the document will be prepared jointly with one or more other local authority;
 - and the timetable for the preparation of document.
- 2.4 The new revised LDS can be found at **Appendix A.** This sets out the current intended timetable for the preparation of the next Local Plan. This reflects the amended timetable to conclude the preparation of the HENA, SoCG and related strategic evidence, which form important inputs to the Local Plan.

3. Factors affecting the new revised Local Development Scheme

- 3.1 Within the new LDS is an identification of some key risks which may impact on the preparation of the next Local Plan, and how these risks will be mitigated. Although some of the risks are within our control, some, for example, changes to government policy and legislation, are not. During the Second Reading of the Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill (LURB), the Secretary of State, Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) indicated that a new version of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) would be issued following a period of consultation later in the year; date to be confirmed. Therefore, it is important to recognise that the LDS will continue to be kept under review, in accordance with the Government's Planning Policy Guidance (PPG) and any factors necessitating its review will be brought back to Cabinet along with a revised LDS that has been updated accordingly.
- 3.2 To ensure efficient and effective governance of the plan preparation process, the Local Plan Advisory Panel will be briefed on the LURB as it proceeds

through Parliament. Members will also be advised as to the implications of changes to the NPPF.

3.3 The recent review of the current adopted Local Plan concluded that the plan remains up to date and continues to deliver sustainable development for Harborough District. The review also confirmed that Local Plan policies continue to broadly reflect the requirements of the latest NPPF, and that the policies continue to support sustainable development across the district. Updating the LDS provides further evidence that we have, and intend to continue, to have an up-to-date Local Plan managing development across the district in a sustainable manner moving forward. The LDS demonstrates we continue to make active progress on plan-making which is a key Government requirement.
