Position statement

Cybercrime continues to be a real concern in our District as across the Country with new scams appearing daily and increase in the use of technology enabling exploitation of the vulnerable inside their own homes.

Financial fraud and scams is now one of the main concerns of our Parishes and residents.

We do not have local figures of cybercrimes, but nationally just over a million offences were estimated by the Crime Survey for England and Wales in the year ending September 2019. This compares with 21,471 offences referred to the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) by Action Fraud (the public-facing national fraud and cybercrime reporting centre).

We continue to raise awareness of online fraud as it is reported to us and push messages around Take Five.
